Pesticides and bees: EFSA finalises new guidance

EFSA has published new guidance for assessing the potential risks to bees from the use of pesticides. The previous EU risk assessment scheme for honeybees did not take full account of risks from chronic or repeat exposure to pesticides or the potential risks to larvae. The new guidance fills these gaps as well as adding schemes for bumble bees and solitary bees.

EFSA in 2012: marking the first 10 years, preparing for future challenges

EFSA reached its tenth anniversary in 2012, a landmark year in which it delivered another significant work programme that built on the achievements of the previous decade. EFSA's Annual Report, which is published today, highlights the progress made last year in key scientific areas, in relations with stakeholders, cooperation with partners, and in reinforcing the measures the Authority has in place to ensure the independence of its scientific work.



Meat inspection: EFSA completes review of practices and recommends improvements

EFSA has completed a major piece of work that will provide the scientific basis for the modernisation of meat inspection across the EU. Following a risk based approach, EFSA has identified and ranked public health hazards in meat. As requested by the European Commission, EFSA has recommended improvements to meat inspection procedures to protect consumers from risks related to such hazards.

EFSA recognises that stakeholders want to better understand the risk assessment process. If advice and action in relation to food safety risks are to be trusted, it is crucial that the way these decisions are made can be scrutinised and understood. Therefore, the Authority has increased the number of opportunities for Observers to attend meetings of its Scientific Panels.



EFSA reports on *Listeria* levels in certain ready-to-eat foods

The first part of EFSA's analysis of an EU-wide baseline survey on *Listeria monocytogenes* published today provides valuable insights into the presence of this bacteria in certain ready-to-eat foods (fish, cold meats and soft cheeses). The proportion of food samples exceeding the legal food safety limit was low. However, given the popularity of these foods and the severe implications that *Listeria* infections can have on human health, overall vigilance regarding the possible presence of the bacteria in food is warranted.
